Charlotte May Pemberton daughter of the late Edward Martin Station and Marion Carol (Lattiak) Station was born May 8, 1933, in Chicago, Illinois where she grew up.

Charlotte followed the Catholic faith and was a long-time beloved member of St. Jude Catholic Church in Richland.

Charlotte was a charter member of the local American Legion Auxiliary and had just recently received her sixty-year pin.

On a bright and sunny afternoon Charlotte passed away, Monday, May 9, 2022 after just reaching her 89th birthday on Sunday, surrounded by the family she loved so dearly while in the Lake Regional Hospital, Osage Beach, Missouri. The world became a little darker as goodbyes were said, but heaven became a whole lot brighter as God welcomed Charlotte into her heavenly home.

Charlotte never let her health struggles bring her down. She decided to find the joy and blessings in every day. She was funny, mischievous, and ornery. Charlotte was a jokester and enjoyed a good laugh. She had a beautiful smile that could light up any room along

with her bubbly personality which made Charlotte a joy to be around.

She is preceded in death by her parents, beloved husband, Frank, one sister, Vivian Pemberton, and daughter, Christine Malley.
