Andrea M. Glen, daughter of Heinz and Gisela (Raua) Hartherz, was born June 17, 1963 in Hanau, Germany. She passed away Monday, October 21, 2019 in her home having attained the age of 56 years.

As a young girl, Andrea grew up in Wachenbuchen-Maintal, Germany and attended school in Hanau.
