It was a blast and our group was so tight because of those nights. We were truly family. It would be like 5 or 6 on 1 and they would never hurt each other, but they would take them down and hold them down and put them in holds. More than once I got told to make sure those boys did not do that ever again. But, if you could have heard them talk about the planning of each of these occasions, it was the funniest thing ever.

Having said all that, Brandon will be missed by me. I have talked to him numerous times about things in his life. An old coach like me should not have to watch his players struggle as Brandon did. An old coach should not have to say goodbye to his players. It should be the other way around. I mourn for his family and for especially for his son.
