Charles Wayne Moser, son of the late Donald Paul Moser and Betty Mae (Mayhan) Vlach, was born October 22, 1953 in Little Rock, Arkansas where he grew up and graduated from high school. He furthered his education and received his college degree.

Charles entered the United States Army and served his country faithfully until his retirement. He had attained the rank of Staff Sergeant and earned several awards and commendations; some of which include: Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (2nd Award), Army Commendation Medal w/“V” Device, Army Commendation Medal (4th Award), National Defense Service Medal (2nd Award), Southwest Asia Service Medal, Kuwait Liberation Medal, NCO Professional Development Ribbon (2nd Award), Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (5th Award), Sharpshooter Qualification Badge M-16 Rifle, Expert Qualification Badge .45 Caliber Pistol, and Expert Qualification Badge M9 Pistol.

After retiring from the military, Charles owned and operated a construction business along with a dear friend. He worked for a time for Tracker Boats in Lebanon but spent most of his working years in construction.

Charles was an avid outdoorsman, and you could find him hunting, fishing, or just being outside enjoying nature. He was also a member of the Disabled

American Veterans for many years.

On June 10, 2000, in Crocker, Missouri, Charles was united in marriage to Jean Patricia Moser and at the time of their union, Charles gained two stepdaughters, Stephanie and Heather. Charles and Jean shared almost fifteen years together before she preceded him in death on April 26, 2015.

Charles passed away Wednesday, February 28, 2024, in the Lake Regional Hospital of Osage Beach, Missouri having attained the age of 70 years. He will be sadly missed, but fondly remembered by all those that knew and loved him.

Charles leaves to cherish his memory, two stepdaughters: Stephanie Wiorek (Jason) of Jefferson City, MO, and Heather Failing of Crocker, MO; four step-grandchildren: Courtney Hartline (Nathan), Emily Davis (Demetri), Kimberly Pyle, and Kaaylob Frisby; great-granddaughter: Saylor Hartline; two sisters: Anita Salyers (Lee) of the state of Ohio and Linda Hill (Jim) of Lebanon, MO; other relatives and friends.
