Charles Davis Wilson, Jr., one of five children born to the late Charles Davis and Phoebe Ellen (Bellington) Wilson, Sr. was born on the family's general livestock farm in Camden County near Richland, Missouri on July 7, 1935 and departed August 9, 2012 at the farm. He was 77 years of age.

At a young age, Charles Davis was baptized in Sellars Creek. He attended Beulah Baptist Church and First Baptist Church in Richland. He was an active member of the First Southern Baptist Church in Waukegan, IL serving as church treasurer. Charles Davis attended school in Richland and graduated from Richland High School in 1955.

In May 1955, he was united in marriage to Shirley Gean Rogers of Stoutland, MO. They made their home in Waukegan, IL where he was an electrician by trade. They raised four children together and later divorced. Charles Davis continued to make his home in Waukegan with many trips back to the family farm.

Charles Davis loved his family very much. Special times were when they would share a meal together and spend time reminiscing on the farm. He especially enjoyed the annual Bellington Squirrel Hunt get together and the Wilson Reunion when he could attend. The family will cherish their memories of those times together.

His pride and joy were his gas engines that he displayed at different events around the Midwest and Florida, even the Tri-County Fair in Richland a couple years. He was a member of the Farm Heritage Club in Lake County, IL. He was a regular morning visitor to McDonald's in Waukegan where he visited with his friends and neighbors while enjoying a good cup of coffee, reading the paper and talking politics.

He is survived by three children: Charles Davis (Angie) Wilson III of Phoenix, AZ, Deborah Jean Schneider of Cincinnati, OH and Marvin Dwaine (Jenny) Yoder Jr. of Stoutland, MO; three sisters: Shirley Sue (Gene) Edwards of Crocker, MO, Dona Beth Sippio of Loveland, CO, Peggy (Floyd) Beavens of Kansas City, MO and his special friend, Karen Hansen of Richland, MO.
