



## Charles "Charlie" Brown

Charles "Charlie" Roscoe Brown, son of Willis Roscoe and Delphine (Long) Brown, was born January 2, 1950 in Crocker, Missouri. Charlie grew up in the Richland/Waynesville area and graduated from Richland High School in 1968.

After graduation, Charlie moved Waynesville and began working for Dewey Wilson where he drove a wrecker and worked in the garage. He would later begin driving a cab for Gateway and City Cab companies and did so for 17 years. He also worked as a carpenter for the Union and helped build the Burger King on Fort Leonard Wood and also the prison in Kansas City, Kansas. After many years of working for different people, Charlie was able to start his own business as a locksmith. He enjoyed having his own business.

On October 13, 1985, Charlie was united in marriage to Pauline Marcie Cloven at the Harmony Baptist Church of Waynesville. They shared over 24 years of marriage together and many wonderful memories.

In his spare time, Charlie enjoyed being outdoors while fishing and hunting and was always telling big stories about the ones that got away. He also liked to play free games, but especially Texas Hold Em' Poker. Most importantly, he treasured those times that he could spend with his family and friends.

Charlie passed away at 10:57 a.m., Monday, July 19, 2010, at his home at the
