“ My name is Thomas Robinson Jr, I served twelve years as Deputy Director of the Edwin R. Bradley Radiological Laboratories. SFC Cynthia Spriggs at the U.S. Army Chemical School at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. Cynthia was one of the most dedicated and professional Chemical soldiers I had the pleasure of working with during my service. Cynthia served at the Chemical School in the Radiological Division initially as NCOIC of One Station Unit Training (OSUT) department responsible for training initial entry soldiers in radiological operations. Because of her outstanding leadership qualities she was assigned to the Advanced Training Department, training NCO's attending the Advanced Noncommissioned Officers Course (ANCOC), the Chemical Officer's Basic Course (COBC) and the Chemical Captains Career Course (CMC3). After her retirement from the Army, because of her detailed knowledge of Radiological operations, Cynthia Spriggs was hired by Department of Defense to serve as a radiological instructor on the staff of the Edwin R. Bradley, Radiological Laboratories, Fort Leonard Wood, MO. Her dedication to the department and quality of training of Radiation Safety Officers Course resulted in providing the U.S. Army Chemical Corp with the some of most highly trained Radiation Safety Officers (RSO's) Army wide. Cynthia Spriggs (SFC Retired) was truly a professional in her field and a great credit to herself, her family, the Chemical Corps and the United States Army. It was an absolute honor to have served with her. She was one of the best, but more importantly a true leader and a great friend.
