Danny Lee Ogle, of Waynesville, son of Kenneth Leroy and Flora Lorraine (Bookout) Ogle, was born May 15, 1950 in Lebanon, Missouri. His family later moved to Pulaski County where he attended school and was a 1968 graduate of Waynesville High School.

On July 18, 1970 at the First Freewill Baptist Church of Waynesville, Danny was united in marriage with Judith Lynn Tucker. Danny and Judy shared nearly 27 years of marriage and two sons and one daughter together.

From 1970 to 1972, Danny served in the U.S. Army having attained the rank of Specialist.

Danny worked for over 25 years as a welder at the Lowe Boat factory, now known as O.M.C. Aluminum Boats in Lebanon. He loved the peace and quiet of nature, and enjoyed any outdoor activity, such as cutting wood and fishing and hunting. He was always ready to lend a helping hand to anyone and was a wonderful family man.

Danny departed this life the afternoon of July 15, 1997 as the result of injuries sustained in a pick-up truck accident on I-44 near Hazelgreen, Missouri. He was 47 years of age. He will be sadly missed by his family and friends.

Service were under the direction of Waynesville Memorial Chapel.
