



## Delilah Mae Dyer

April 21, 1927 - January 7, 2025

Delilah Mae (Rogers) Dyer, daughter of the late Melvin Ernest Rogers and Martha Elizabeth (Exendine) Rogers, was born April 21, 1927, in Brownville, Missouri. As a young girl, Delilah grew up around Lebanon and attended Laclede County School.

Delilah began working at an early age and worked as a sewing machine operator at Rice's in Lebanon (which later became the Lee Factory) for several years. After leaving the factory in 1963, she became the owner and operator of the Bamboo Lounge and operated it until her retirement in 1983.

In her spare time, Delilah loved to dance and party and was an avid reader. She was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary #331 and the VFW Ladies Auxiliary #3176.

Delilah passed away Tuesday, January 7, 2025, in the Life Care Center of Waynesville, Missouri having attained the age of 97 years.

Delilah leaves to cherish her memory a host of nieces and nephews including Janet Klingensmith of Waynesville, MO, Linda Crossland of St. Robert, MO, Stobey Abney (Ruth) of the State of Illinois, Francis Anderson (Rodney) of the State of Minnesota, Larry Myers (Paula) of Springfield, MO, and Gale Myers of Lebanon, MO, along with other relatives and friends.
