Don entered the United States Army and served his country faithfully until his retirement in 2022. 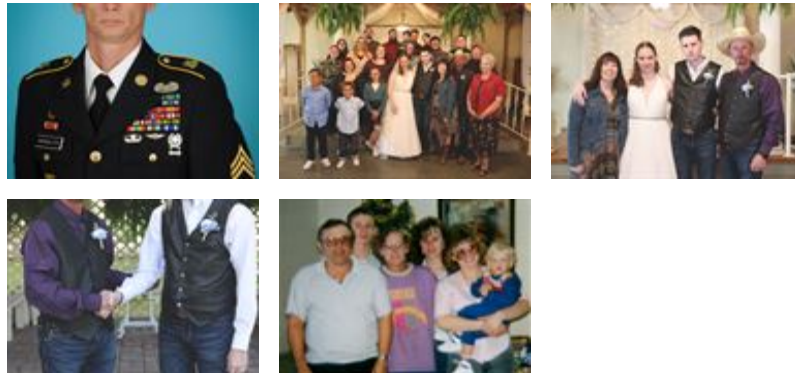
