Emmett Brumley, Jr., son of the late Emmett Brumley, Sr. and Lela Viola (Pummill) Brumley, was born February 21, 1936, in Iberia, Missouri.

Shortly after his birth, Emmett and his family moved to Michigan for a few years before moving back to the Crocker, Missouri area when Emmett was 7-8 years of age. He began attending Crocker Elementary School and graduated from Crocker High School with the Class of 1954.

Emmett met a young lady by the name of Patsy Marie Walters. They began dating and were united in marriage on November 11, 1955, in Crocker, Missouri at the "Old Christian Church". They shared over 69 years of marriage together and were blessed with two children: Melinda and Mark.

Emmett took great pride in providing for his family. He served as a wire communications cable splicer for the Directorate of Communications and Electronics on Fort Leonard Wood for approximately 30 years.

In his spare time, Emmett enjoyed being outdoors; you could find him either camping, fishing, hunting or working in his garden (which he gave half of it away to his neighbors and friends). He loved traveling with classmates and friends and back in their younger days, you could find him and Patsy playing many a card games with friends.

Early in his life, Emmett made an important decision. He accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior and was baptized on August 31, 1948. His faith helped him throughout the rest of his life through some of the darkest times in his life and some of the happiest times as well. He and Patsy were faithful members of the Crocker Christian Church and were very involved in the different activities. You could find them helping with Journey to Bethlehem and one thing he thoroughly enjoyed doing with the church was going to Springfield Cardinal baseball games.

Emmett went home to be with the Lord on Sunday, November 17, 2024, in his home in Crocker having attained the age of 88 years of age. He will be sadly missed, but fondly remembered by all those that knew and loved him.
