Franklin I. "Frank" Mann, son of Henry and Mary (Powell) Mann, was born September 10, 1943, in Uniontown, Kentucky. He departed this life Friday, September 18, 2020, at his home in Waynesville, Missouri, at the age of seventy-seven years and eight days.
