George K. Warnock, son of the late Aubra and Anna (Wagner) Warnock, was born December 10, 1946 in Bronx, New York where he grew up and attended school.

As a young man, George enlisted in the United States Army and served his country faithfully until his retirement after 20 years of service. He had done two tours of duty in Vietnam during his career. George had attained the rank of First Sergeant and was awarded several medals and commendations. Some of those include: National Defense Service Medal-2, Army Service Ribbon, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Service Medal-3, Republic of Vietnam Cross of Gallantry w/Palm (Unit), Bronze Star Medal, Overseas Service Ribbon-2, Army Good Conduct Medal-7, Meritorious Service Medal, Noncommissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon-3, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal-3 and Sharpshooter Qualification Badge M-16.

After retiring from the military, George was able to do some of the things that he enjoyed. He enjoyed traveling, going the movies with friends and having a nice dinner. He loved to play the stock market and a good game of cards. Most importantly, he loved spending time with his friends.

George passed away at 12:45 p.m. Tuesday, October 18, 2011 in the

University of Missouri Hospital and Clinics of Columbia, Missouri. He had attained the age of 64 years, 10 months and 8 days.

George is survived by three children: Jeannie, Johnny and George, Jr. Warnock; five siblings: Elsa Scott, John Warnock (Jeanie), Audrey Bohrer, Anna Warnock and Linda Young (Ronald); one granddaughter: Rosa Marie Rivera; one great granddaughter: Evelun Dorothy Murphy; fiancé and best friend of over 20 years: Vera York; several nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
