James Arthur King, son of Bernell King, Sr. and Venora Sue Frazier King, was born June 16, 1951 in Ft. Worth Texas. The family moved to St. Louis, Missouri where James school. At the age of 17 he joined the Marines. While in the military, James received several medals of Honor during Vietnam and was given an honorable discharge after serving from 1968 until 1970.

James later matriculated at several schools ending in Lincoln University of Jefferson City, Missouri where he majored in Art. He was an accomplished and recognized artist with his works in permanent exhibition at Lincoln University, other galleries over the country several private homes. He entered a national competition while attending Lincoln and won First Place.

He leaves to cherish his memory his wife: Patricia Louise King of St. Robert, MO; three daughters: Quandra Z. King Brown of St. Louis, MO; Jazmyn L. He was preceded in death by his father: Bernell King Sr.; three brothers: Bernell King Jr., Michael King and a brother who died in infancy.

A memorial service with military honors was held at 3:00 P.M. Tuesday, February 6, 2007 in the Memorial Chapel of Waynesville/St. Robert with Pastor Richard Anderegg officiating. Organist Karen Boorum accompanied the congregation as they sang "Amazing Grace" and "The Old Rugged Cross". The song "Wayfaring Stranger" was also played. Military honors were provided by the United States Marine Corp of Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri.
