



SFC (Ret) Jeffrey Alan Gallagher

November 22, 1958 - February 3, 2026

Jeffrey Alan Gallagher, son of the late LeRoy Gallagher and Alma Annis (Gambee) Gallagher, was born on November 22, 1958, in Portland, Oregon. He grew up in Tillamook, Oregon, where he graduated from Tillamook High School. Jeffrey continued his education at Washington State University, receiving a Bachelor of Science Degree in Construction Management.

Following his graduation from college, Jeffrey enlisted in the United States Army, where he served with dedication until his retirement in 2007.

He had attained the rank of Sergeant First Class and earned several awards and commendations, some of which include: Meritorious Service Medal (2nd Award), Army Commendation Medal (6th Award), Army Achievement Medal (5th Award), Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Army Good Conduct Medal (7th Award), National Defense Service Medal (2nd Award), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korean Defense Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Non Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon (3rd Award), Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (3rd Award), Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, and Drill Sergeant Identification Badge.

During his military career, Jeffrey served at several duty stations including Fort Leonard Wood (MO), Ft. Riley (KS), Ft. Carson (CO), Ft. Lewis (WA), New

Cumberland (PA), Ettlingen and Bamberg (Germany), Macedonia, Kosovo, Camp Casey (Korea), and Guantanamo Bay (Cuba). His duties included serving as a Drill Instructor, AC-RC instructor/advisor, Security Augmentation Force (SAF), Casualty Assistance Officer, and Analyst.

While stationed in Germany, Jeffrey met the love of his life, Gabriela Littwin, whom he married on March 25, 1988. Together, they enjoyed over 37 years of marriage and were blessed with three children: Niamh, Fionn, and Liam.

Jeffrey was passionate about traveling and visited Ireland, Germany, Austria, Netherlands, Italy, Switzerland, England, Canada, and many other countries. His hobbies included reading, collecting tax stamps, brewing beer, skiing, music, woodworking and building, hiking, ice hockey, and football. Above all, he cherished the moments spent with his family.

Jeffrey passed away on Tuesday, February 3, 2026, at the Osage Beach Rehab & Health Care Center in Osage Beach, Missouri, at the age of 67. He will be greatly missed and fondly remembered by all who knew and loved him.

In addition to his parents, Jeffrey was preceded in death by his son, Liam Gallagher. He leaves behind his wife, Gaby Gallagher; daughter, Niamh Gallagher (Stephen Trudell); son, Fionn Gallagher; siblings Jennifer Gallagher, Dan Gallagher (Maggie), Laura Gallagher, Joe Gallagher (Linda), Mike Gallagher (Miriam), and Bill Gallagher (Anneke); mother-in-law, Ingrid Littwin; brother-in-law, Alexander Littwin (Julia); as well as numerous nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.
