



## Jimmie Lee Jones, Jr.

July 30, 1953 - February 23, 2016

Jimmie Lee Jones, Jr., son of the late James Lee and Lillian N. (Rowden) Jones, was born July 30, 1953 in Waynesville, Missouri.

Jimmie lived in the Richland area until the age of six before moving to Chicago, Illinois where he graduated High School at age 18. He lived most of his life in Steger, Illinois.

Jimmie fell in love with Lynne Diane Condon and the two were married on July 15, 1991, in Mountain Home, Arkansas. They shared nearly twenty five years together along with Jimmie's four children, Jennifer, Jimmie Lee, Joseph and Kristie.

In 2013, Jimmie and Lynne moved to Richland, Missouri, fulfilling Jimmie's dream of purchasing his beloved grandparent's farm. Even though his time there brief, a lifetime of precious memories was made as he lived each day to its fullest.

Jimmie worked for Roadway as a spotter for twenty five years. In 2002 he began working as an orderly at Ingalls Hospital for ten years before moving.

In his earlier years, Jimmie was a member of the Moose Lodge and the American Pool Players Association. In his spare time, Jimmie enjoyed being

outdoors camping, fishing and hunting. However, his treasures in this life were his family, especially his grandchildren, whom he loved and adored.

Jimmie passed away February 23, 2016 in Lake Regional Hospital having attained the age of 62 years. Though he is gone from our sight and will be sadly missed, his legacy will live on forever by those who knew and loved him.

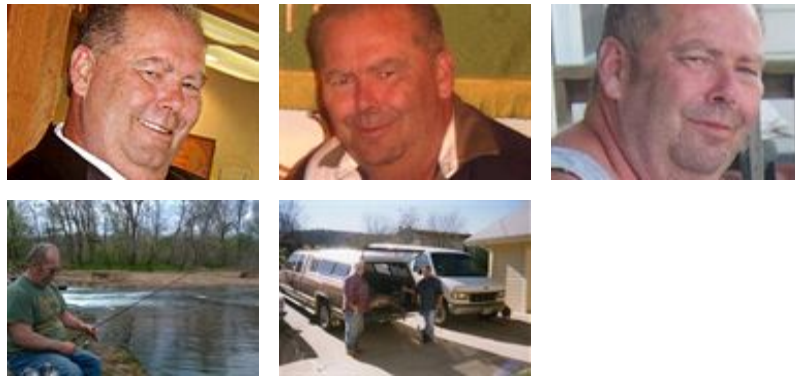
