



Justin Wayne "Dutch" Havens

January 11, 1925 - December 12, 2010

Justin Wayne "Dutch" Havens, son of the late B. Ray and Mary Elizabeth (Tooley) Havens, was born January 11, 1925 in Clayton, New Mexico. He passed away Sunday evening, December 12, 2010, at General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital of Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri at the age of 85 years, 11 months and 1 day.

Dutch, as he was known by his family and friends, served in the United States Marines during World War II from October 14, 1942 until his honorable discharge on October 15, 1945.

On November 4, 1947, Dutch married the love of his life, Emma Belle Culbertson in Burnham, Missouri. They shared over 63 years of marriage together and were blessed with six children: Glen, Walter, Dan, Dorothy, John and Martha.

In 1958, Dutch began working for the 7-Up Cola Company and retired in 1970. After retiring, he worked for the Wayne Keith Golf Company for a short time and then began working for the H.D. Lee Company in Richland and retired in 1988. In his spare time, Dutch enjoyed spending time with his family and friends.

Dutch will be sadly missed by all those that knew and loved him. He leaves to

cherish his memory his wife: Emma; five children: Glen Havens of San Diego, California, Walter Havens of Jasper, Dan Havens and Martha Ferrer both of Waynesville and Dorothy Lambert of Rolla; eleven grandchildren; three great grandchildren; nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

In addition to his parents, Dutch was preceded in death by one son: John; five brothers; and three sisters.

Graveside services with military honors were held at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, December 16, 2010 in the Missouri Veterans Cemetery of Fort Leonard Wood with Rev. Christopher Hendrix officiating. Military honors were provided by the Missouri Honors Team. Services were under the direction of Memorial Chapels and Crematory of Waynesville/St. Robert.
