



## Kan Nan Schuller

April 19, 1937 - December 5, 2010

Kan Nan (Hong) Schuller, 73 of Waynesville, passed away at 6:45 p.m., Sunday, December 5, 2010, at her son's home in St. Peters, Missouri.

Daughter of the late Il Hak (Park) and Joon (Sik), Kan Nan was born on April 20, 1937 in Incheon, South Korea where she grew up and attended school.

Kan Nan was living in Incheon during the Korean War and during this time, she met the love of his life, a GI by the name of Ronald J. Schuller. They were married on January 16, 1962 in South Korea. Ron and Kan Nan shared over 19 years of marriage together and were blessed with two children, Donna and John. Ron passed away in April of 1981.

Kan Nan moved to the United States soon after she and Ron were married. Due to Ron being in the military, they lived in several different areas and eventually retired in Waynesville in 1973. Kan Nan worked on Fort Leonard Wood as a seamstress and retired in 1999.

In 1984, Kan Nan met Robert Kjvorsted and they became long time companions. They had many wonderful memories together.

As a young girl, Kan Nan was raised in the Buddhist faith. After marrying Ron, she converted to the Catholic faith and the last several years attended the

Korean church in Waynesville.

Kan Nan was a very active member of the Korean Association. She played the drums and volunteered for the Association. In her spare time, Kan Nan enjoyed being outdoors while working in her garden and was also very talented with her sewing. Most importantly, she treasured her family and the times that she was able to spend with her grandchildren.
