



Kenneth Leroy Herrmann Jr.

May 1, 1951 - February 10, 2014

Kenneth 'Cork' Leroy Herrmann, Jr., 62, of St. Robert, MO, passed away Monday, February 10, 2014 in his home.

Funeral services will be held at 12:00 p.m. Saturday, February 15, 2014 at the Fort Leonard Wood Main Post Chapel on Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. Burial will be held in Stockton, Kansas.

Visitation will be held from 5:00 – 7:00 p.m. Friday, February 14, 2014 at the Memorial Chapels and Crematory located in Waynesville, Missouri.

Mr. Herrmann was born in Stockton, Kansas and throughout his childhood and adult life, lived in various places all over the world including Louisiana, Texas, Kansas, Iowa, Oregon, Kentucky, The Netherlands, and Germany.

In his personal life, Mr. Herrmann was an avid motorcycle rider. Mr. Herrmann was often seen riding his beloved Harley Davidson motorcycle "Pearl" on the back roads of Pulaski County and on Fort Leonard Wood; sometimes, he could also be found riding "Pearl" on the back roads of Louisiana (with brother Tony) and mountain roads in Colorado as well.

Mr. Herrmann treasured his family and the time spent with daughters Kenna and Kelsi, as well as his granddaughters, Issabella and Helaina. He enjoyed

old time Gospel music, collecting kerosene lamps, acquiring walking sticks and just admiring the simple things in life like playing his guitar.

In his professional life, Mr. Herrmann spent nearly all of his adult life as a member of the US Army Chemical Corps, as both a Soldier and Civilian. Mr. Herrmann (known as "Smoke 1" to many, many Soldiers) personally trained thousands of Officers, Noncommissioned Officers, and Soldiers throughout the Army while stationed with the US Army Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Explosive (CBRNE) School at both Fort McClellan, Alabama and at Fort Leonard Wood. Prior to retiring from the Army as a Staff Sergeant in 1999, Mr. Herrmann served throughout the Army in numerous units, to include the 82nd Airborne Division and the US Army CBRNE School, 3rd Chemical Brigade. Throughout his military service, he was stationed in various locations to include Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Germany; Fort McClellan, Alabama, and Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. After retiring from active duty, Mr. Herrmann continued to serve the US Army and country as a civilian employee with the 84th Chemical Battalion, 3rd Chemical Brigade, US Army CBRNE School, US Army Maneuver Support Center of Excellence for over 15 years, right up until his passing.

Mr. Herrmann is survived by two daughters, Kenna Herrmann and Kelsi Lyon, both of Colorado Springs, Colorado; two granddaughters, Issabella Dorra Herrmann and Helaina Rhae Cook; by brothers Gary (Mary) Fowler of Keswick, Iowa; James 'Beau' (Jessica) Fowler of Montgomery, Louisiana; Terry (Rita) Fowler of La Claire, Iowa; Danny (Mona) Fowler of Sigourney, Iowa; and Tony (Kellie) Fowler of Dry Prong, Louisiana; mother of Kenna and Kelsi: Dorothy Sizemore of Lampasas, TX. His infant twin sister, Georgia Lee; his father and mother, James and Dora Mae Fowler of Montgomery, Louisiana; and his biological father, Kenneth Leroy Herrmann of Palisade, Nebraska, preceded Mr. Herrmann in death.

“ There was a large number of family and friends attending Mr Ken 'Cork' Herrmann's memorial today. In my opinion Ken was one of the greatest trainers the Chemical School has ever had.

Personally, 'Cork' and I clicked immediately. He had already been a DA Civilian when I started my position 13 years ago. He and Mr Ray White provided the civilian continuity and expertise for the battalion's smoke and flame instruction. Smoke training is dirty and grimy; flame weapons training is hot(or freezing) and dangerous. But does anyone recall a time when MR Herrmann did not have a smile on his face while training Soldiers? Training Soldiers came naturally to him and he devoted his life's career to ensuring Soldiers were getting the best of his training abilities.

Cork wasn't a very big man with big muscles, but he had a big heart and willingness to get his work done and help others. He put everyone around him before himself. In fact, when I had seen him in early December, he wanted to get back to work so that others wouldn't have to cover down on his duties too. Although I knew him as an Army Civilian, he was a superb example of what an NCO should be in the military. Mr Herrmann always kept morale up, was a good leader and was as a great follower. Now those of you who knew him well would know that his bike "Pearl" was his prized possession. After work, it was the source of countless hours of joy. He spent weekends riding with family and friends. Cork was very humble and had simple goals: to help the battalion's mission to train Soldiers; to love his daughters and love his precious little grandchildren and family.

Ken Herrmann sudden illness and death is a tragedy, but he will continue to serve as a model for others to emulate and appreciate. He will be dearly missed and never forgotten by those who have met him. God speed my friend and I hope you will rest in peace forever.

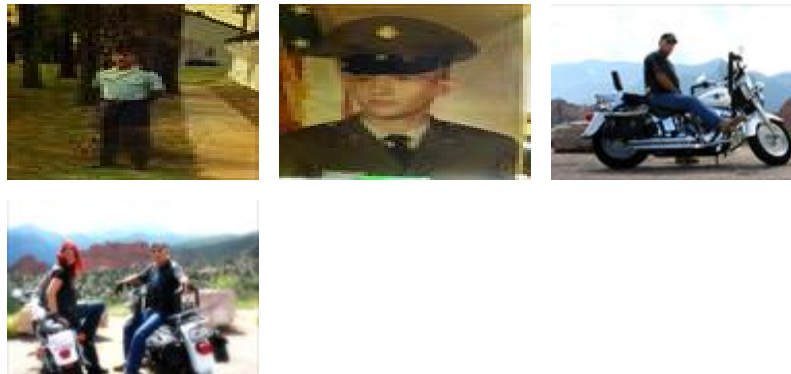
