Letty Mae Williams, 82 of Crocker passed from this life the morning of Tuesday, June 7, 2011 in her granddaughter's home.

Daughter of William Wagner and Lennie Schultz Wagner, Letty Mae was born May 1, 1929 in Bloodland, Missouri. She was the next to the youngest of 11 children. Letty Mae attended Tribune, Missouri school and later on went to graduate from Dixon, Missouri High School in 1946.

Letty Mae was an extremely hard worker throughout her years. She was a waitress around this area for many of her earlier years. She then worked at a boat factory in Richland, Missouri and moved on to Eldon, Missouri to work for another boat factory, where she later became a supervisor while there. She enjoyed sewing and made many outfits for Joey and Donna to wear to school when they were younger. She absolutely loved shopping and going to

yard sales. She could never have enough clothes or shoes. One of her greatest characteristics was her unselfishness. She always had someone else in mind. If she thought it was a bargain and someone she knew could get some use out of it, whatever it might have been, then she bought it.
