Lynda Charlene (Long) Nalley, the youngest of three daughters of Elmer Long and Myrtle Mae (Williams) Long, was born on April 8, 1952, in Waynesville, Missouri. She passed away Sunday, February 23, 2025, in the Lake Regional Hospital of Osage Beach, Missouri having attained the age of 72 years.

Charlene, as she was known by her family and friends, grew up in Waynesville where she attended school and graduated from Waynesville High School with the Class of 1970.

Charlene will be sadly missed but fondly remembered by all those that knew and loved her.
