Lyndia Marie Williams, daughter of the late Raymond Edward Dusenberry and Vivian Opal (Stark) Dusenberry, was born October 7, 1941, in Kansas City, Kansas. The family later moved to Old Bagnall, Missouri for a short time before moving to Eldon, Missouri where she graduated from high school. Lyndia furthered her education and graduated from School of the Osage in Point Lookout, Missouri.

Lyndia began working at the telephone company in Eldon and they transferred her to an office in St. Louis. After moving to St. Louis, Lyndia met a young soldier by the name of Delmar Ilif Williams. They began dating and were united in marriage on August 29, 1964, in Bagnall, Missouri. Lyndia and Delmar were blessed with four children: Brenda, Harold, Balinda, and Jennifer.

Due to Delmar being in the military, Lyndia and the family transferred to different duty stations with Delmar. They were stationed in Germany, Fort Leonard Wood (MO), South Carolina, and Germany again before Delmar retired from the military.

The family then moved to a farm in Iowa and in 1980 moved to Richland, Missouri where they made their home for the remainder of their days.

Lyndia and Delmar began taking care of the Oaklawn Cemetery in Richland and did so for many years until their health began to decline. They took great pride in caring for the loved ones that were laid to rest in the cemetery.

In her spare time, Lyndia enjoyed watching nature, especially hummingbirds and putting puzzles together. She loved her family dearly and enjoyed spending time with them.

Early in her life, Lyndia had made a profession of faith and was currently a member of the Grace Baptist Church of Richland. She went home to be with her Lord on Friday, August 23, 2024, in the Life Care Center of Waynesville having attained the age of 82 years.
