



SFC (Ret) Melvin Joseph Hagerty

November 4, 1934 - February 17, 2015

SFC (Ret) Melvin Joseph Hagerty, son of the late Louis and Madeline (Schmitt) Hagerty, was born November 4, 1934 in Epworth, Iowa. As a young boy, Melvin grew up on the family farm.

On February 13, 1956, Melvin entered the United States Army and served his country faithfully until his retirement on September 30, 1979 after 23 years of service. He had attained the rank of Sergeant First Class and earned several awards and commendations; some of which included: National Defense Service Medal, Bronze Star Medal (2nd Oak Leaf Cluster), Army Commendation Medal (2nd Oak Leaf Cluster), Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, Meritorious Unit Citation, Good Conduct Medal (5th Award), Expert Qualification Badge M16 and M14, Vietnam Service Medal w/ 2 Silver Service Stars and Vietnam Service Medal w/3 Bronze Service Stars. Five of his years of service were spent in the Vietnam War.

On April 27, 1972, Melvin was united in marriage to Phuong Thi Nguyen in Illinois. They shared over 42 years of marriage together and shared seven children: Jason, Jennifer, Jessica, Kim, Melvin, Deb and Patricia.

After retiring from the military, Melvin began working as a civilian on Fort Leonard Wood in 1982. At the age of 77, he was the second oldest working civilian on the post. He worked at the Engineer Warrant Officer Course. Melvin

retired as a DOD civilian at the age of 79 after 30yrs of service with a combined service of 53yrs

In his spare time, Melvin enjoyed being outdoors while mowing his lawn and driving his tractor. He also liked to watch westerns, but most importantly, he loved spending time with his grandchildren.

Melvin passed away Tuesday, February 17, 2015 in the Phelps County Regional Medical Center of Rolla, Missouri having attained the age of 80 years, 3 months and 13 days. He will be sadly missed by all those that knew and loved him.

Melvin leaves to cherish his memory, his wife: Phuong Hagerty of St. Robert, MO; six children: Jason Hagerty and wife Erica of Waynesville, MO, Jennifer Wallace and husband Michael of Villa Rica, GA, Jessica Reid and husband Danny of Laquey, MO, Kim Fisch and husband David of Dubuque, IA, Melvin J. Hagerty of Casper, WY, and Deb Hagerty of Sebastian, FL; eighteen grandchildren: Mason, Michaelyn, Wesley, Aiden, Kaleb, Kayla, Carol, Elijah, Scarlet, Kenneth, Kurt, Michael, Louis, JoAnna, Kris, Randi, Vince and Sam; eleven great grandchildren; other relatives and friends.

In addition to his parents, Melvin was preceded in death by his daughter, Patricia, son James David Hagerty and two grandchildren, Matthew and Isaiah Reid.

Graveside services with military honors were held at 1:00 p.m. Monday, February 23, 2015 in the Missouri Veterans Cemetery of Waynesville, Missouri with Pastor Larry Atkins and Chaplain Michael Roberts officiating. Serving as escorts and providing military honors were the United States Army of Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. Services were under the direction of Memorial Chapels and Crematory of Waynesville / St. Robert.

“ There isn't an Engineer Maintenance; Enlisted Service Member, NCO or Engineer Warrant who could say that Mr. Hagerty has not affected their life. My first experience with Mr. Hagerty was when I was a 'young Soldier' and he was an instructor for my BNCO class back in 1988. I again had the privilege of having him as an instructor for my Warrant Officer Basic in 2000 and again for my Warrant Officer Advance Course in 2007. I remember more than once a Soldier would either email or call him from overseas about air conditioning and generator issues asking for his advice. If Mr. Hagerty didn't already have the answer in his head from years of experience he would then look at a schematic and sometimes within minutes tell the Soldier to check for grounds at this point, check what your voltage is at this relay, and within minutes from thousands of miles away he was able to help a Soldier in need who had been pulling out his hair trying to fix a generator or air conditioner. No one really knew Mr. Hagerty's age but then no one cared because no matter how old he was he always had something new to teach you every day. Yes he smoked too much, and maybe he did spend a lot of time at the school house with students, but I feel his contribution at Fort Leonard Wood has developed a generation (okay maybe a couple generations now) of skilled and more knowledgeable maintenance smart Soldiers because of the

time God has allowed us to share Mr. Hagerty's time on this earth. I always looked forward to seeing him anytime I was at the school house and learning new things from him. Mr. Hagerty will be missed by thousands of Soldiers, civilians and I feel sorry for every Soldier who will never know what it was like to be taught by one of the greatest. My prayers go out to the family and friends of Mr. Hagerty as this now 'old Soldier', will miss him.

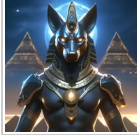
