Opal Workman, daughter of the late Drue and Aliene (Siler) Archer, was born December 1, 1924 in Bethel Springs, Tennessee. As a young girl, Opal and her family moved to the St. Louis area and she graduated from St. Louis Public School.

On February 21, 1943, Opal was united in marriage to Ronald Workman in Waynesville, Missouri at the courthouse. They shared many wonderful years of marriage together and were blessed with three daughters: Ronda, Donna and Deborah.

As a young woman, Opal made an important decision in her life and on October 21, 1945, Opal was baptized at the Lafayette Baptist Church.

Opal was a hardworking woman. After moving to the Richland, Missouri area, she and Ronald owned and operated Workman's Restaurant for 35 years. She was a member of the Business and Professional Women and the Garden Club.

In her spare time, Opal enjoyed working outside in her yard and her flower gardens. She loved to decorate her home, especially at Christmas time, was very talented in landscape painting and enjoyed shopping. Most importantly, she cherished those times that she could spend with her family and friends,

especially her grandchildren. All those that knew and loved her will sadly miss her.

Opal went home to be with her Lord at 10:25 p.m., Sunday, April 25, 2010, at St. John's Regional Health Center of Springfield at the age of 85 years, 4 months and 24 days.

Burial followed in the Oaklawn Cemetery. Services were under the direction of Memorial Chapel of Richland.

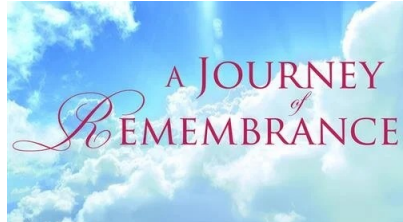

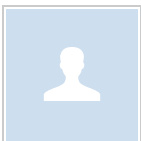
