Rosemary Pinson, 81, of Hot Springs, Arkansas, passed away on January 24, 2025 in Jefferson City, Missouri. She was born in Houston, Texas on September 10, 1943. 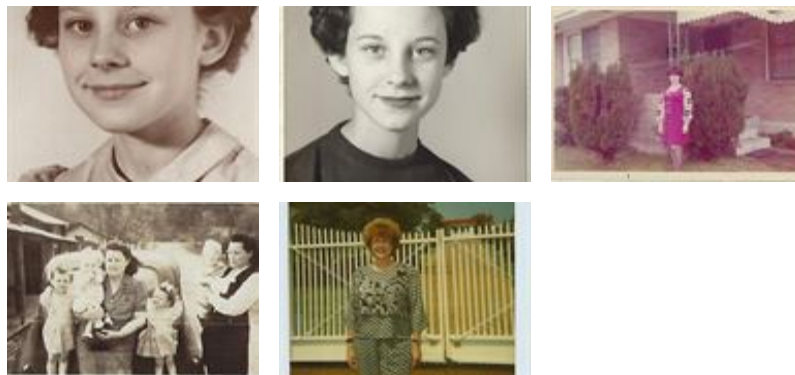
