January 30, 1951 - October 22, 2018

Wanda Sue Pruitt was born January 30, 1951 in Waynesville, Missouri to Jack Edward and Mary Lou (Black) Southard and passed away at her home in Richland, Missouri on Monday, October 22, 2018, having attained the age of 67.

On June 19, 1971 in Richland, Missouri, Wanda Sue was married to the love of her life, John Wayne Pruitt. God blessed them with over 47 wonderful years together and two fine sons.

Wanda accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at a young age; faithfully serving Him throughout her life. She was a lifetime member of First Baptist Church of Richland where she enjoyed singing in the choir.

Wanda grew up in the Richland and Laquey areas. She attended elementary in Laquey and later went on to attend Richland, graduating from RHS in 1969. A good education was very important to Wanda. She went on to obtain her Master's degree and began a lifelong teaching career. Some would call her a "professional student" due to her willingness to go after another degree. She taught elementary at Laquey as well as, gifted education at both Laquey and Lebanon until retiring. Later Wanda taught education classes at OTC.

Wanda's love for children continued as she served as a Court Appointed

Special Advocate (CASA) in Rolla, Missouri.

Wanda belonged to the Missouri Retired Teachers Association and the Order of the Eastern Star.

In her spare time Wanda greatly enjoyed spending time with her family, especially her grandchildren who she loved and adored. She loved to travel with John; the mountains were a favorite spot. Wanda also enjoyed walks and talks with her friends, baking cheesecakes, and reading. Wanda was a “get it done” kind of gal. She always payed close attention to even the smallest details and was extremely efficient in whatever she tackled. Wanda suffered with rheumatoid arthritis most of her life however; she never let it rob her of living a full life; nor did she let it define her in any way...it was simply part of life, and she dealt with it one day at a time.

Wanda leaves behind to cherish her memory her loving husband, John of the home; two sons: Doug Pruitt (Jenni) of Troy, MO, and Rob Pruitt (Janelle) of Kansas City, MO; 5 grandchildren: Allison Fisher (Dalton) of Richland, MO, Evan and Owen Pruitt both of Troy, MO, Jonathan Pruitt and Olivia Pruitt both of Kansas City, MO; her siblings: Wilma Jenkins (Patrick) of Conway, SC, Larry Southard (Anita Ivey) of Richland, MO; one sister-in-law: Kathy Williams (Leon) of Richland, MO; several nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends. In addition to her parents, Wanda was preceded in death by her sister, Beth Voigt (December 15, 2013).

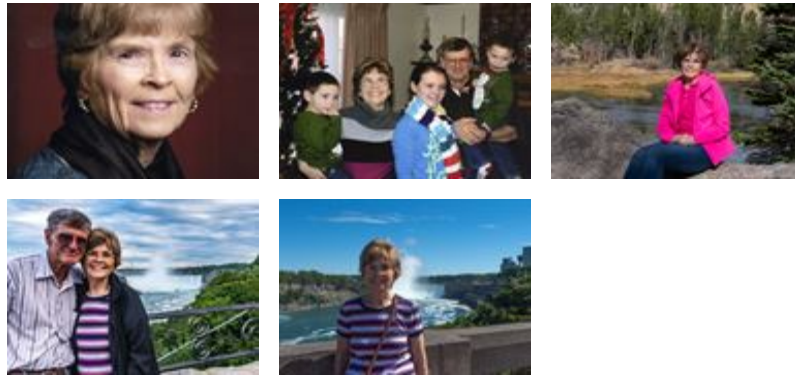
