Wayne Daniel Gifford, son of the late Elmer Lawrence Gifford and Velma Ruth (Sayers) Gifford, was born in Lebanon, Missouri on September 30, 1955.

Wayne spent his formative years attending schools within the Laquey School District through the eighth grade. He began his high school journey at Richland High School, where he graduated with the Class of 1973 at the age of 16.

During his time in college at “Hard Work U”, Wayne took pride in holding various positions, including truck driving. After graduating, he prepared to join the United States Marine Corps, completing basic training and serving a year in the Reserves. However, when the time came to begin active duty, Wayne chose to pursue law school instead. After earning his law degree at the age of 22, he began his own legal practice in May 1978. He was elected as prosecuting attorney in August 1978 and was sworn in on January 2, 1979, at the age of 23. At the time of his swearing in, the prosecuting attorney’s position was a part time position.

On January 1, 1979, Wayne married Linda Carol Butler in Lebanon, Missouri. Their union lasted over 46 years and brought them two children: Brad and Jessica.

Wayne enjoyed collecting and operating John Deere tractors. He also loved taking road trips, reading, and watching movies, with a particular fondness for films starring John Wayne and Clint Eastwood.

Wayne was an active member of the Democratic Party and the Pulaski County Bar Association. He supported various organizations, including the USO and YMCA, and during his high school years, he was part of the FFA.

Wayne passed away on his 70th birthday, Tuesday, September 30, 2025, due to injuries sustained in a traffic accident. He will be deeply missed and fondly remembered by all who knew and loved him.

Wayne is survived by his wife, Linda Gifford; his two children, Brad Gifford of Laquey, MO, and Jessica Gifford and her husband Isaac Dodson of Fulton, MO; his grandson, Henry Dodson of Fulton, MO; and four siblings: Rebecca Atwell and her husband Kenneth of Hurst, TX, Robert Gifford of Licking, MO, David Gifford and his wife Anne of Columbia, MO, and Paul Gifford and his wife Sharon of Laquey, MO. He also leaves behind several nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.

In addition to his parents, Wayne was preceded in death by his brother Phillip Gifford.

Wayne was known for his big heart, touching the lives of many through his legal practice and as a host dad to several foreign exchange students. His kindness and legacy will live on forever in the hearts of those who knew him.

“ Wayne and Linda not only opened their home to me, but have made me feel like part of the family. At my lowest, Wayne helped me, and over the years, I found that I wasn't the only one he had helped. Wayne's ways of helping those in need were as diverse as the many layers of his personality. Some he helped by doing their case pro bono, or sometimes, with cash-strapped clients, Wayne took payment for services or goods. He was paid with trailers, a washer & dryer set, and once even a mink coat. Yes, under Wayne's gruff and to-the-point exterior, inside of him was a compassionate family man who truly liked helping others.

Wayne was a great friend who sometimes treated me like a brother and other times like a son, depending on the situation, but he was always there, ready to help, whether it was with simple advice or grueling hard labor. Wayne helped if he could. Once he knew my back was not in the greatest shape, and I had trees from a storm that needed to be cut down and he spent his entire Saturday helping me. Wayne helped folks move with his big box trucks, cut down their damaged trees after storms, and helped so many in so many ways.

Wayne's strength was uncanny. He was country boy strong. Able to lift items that would normally take two men. Breaking bolts off of his tractor, that I had worked on for 20 minutes and couldn't budge. Wayne was strong and tough when he had to be, but most of the time, he was just a big teddy bear. He loved his family and would move heaven and earth to protect them.

Wayne was an intelligent man (graduated from high school and started college at age 16), he always carried a book and would read in any spare moment, and almost always during lunch. He could read a Tom Clancy novel in a day or two. When Wayne would tell a story, most of the time he gave you the information just like an author would. He would set the scene, giving you details on the weather, what day it was, who the characters are, and how they fit. I will certainly miss this about him.

Wayne was frugal, and several times when we had dinner out and he would order a hamburger meal and the waiter would ask if he wanted cheese on that, and he would ask how much more was the cheese, and once they said .55 (fifty five cents), and Wayne said no thank you, he was not paying that much for a peace of cheese...that was for himself. But he had no problem helping others who were in need or just starting. He would purchase items at auctions or at discount shops, not for himself, but for others. Wayne has furnished or outfitted so many apartments and homes, I stopped counting.

Wayne loved auctions and getting a good deal. He knew that I needed 2x6 lumber to repair my soffit at the storage business. I told him I needed about 50 boards. He found 165 boards for \$1 each. I was able to keep my 50 boards and sell the remainder for \$350, making a profit for Wayne and me. He has done the same with plywood, ceiling tiles, and so many other items. He was great at it.

Wayne also loved to shop at Sam's Club. On most of his trips, he would ask me what I needed, and he always looked for my favorite "Habitat" work shirts, and if they had my size, he would get them for me.

There are many aspects and stories about Wayne that I truly can't list them all, I just know that I will miss him. I will miss his friendship. I will miss him calling me in the late evening, telling me to wrap up whatever I was working on, that it would be there tomorrow. I will miss his humor and laugh. I will miss Wayne.
